Rail Europe's top 10 must-see train journeys for 2023

1.The Glacier Express, Switzerland



Route: St. Moritz to Zermatt

Highlights: Spectacular Swiss mountain scenery, 291 bridges, 91 tunnels, Oberalp Pass, 291 km total, 8-hour journey

Cost: 152 CHF (€135) 2nd class, one way, 268 CHF (€237) 1st class, one way trip

2. The Bernina Express, Switzerland



Route: Chur or St. Moritz to Tirano

Highlights: Viaducts bridging huge differences in altitude, narrow-gauge railroad with panoramic views, 4 hours, 144 km journey between icy Switzerland and sunny Italy, 55 tunnels and 196 bridges

Cost: CHF 92 (€93) 2nd class or CHF 161 (€164) 1st class

3. The Flam Railway, Norway



Route: Myrdal to Flam

Highlights: 20 km long, 20 tunnels. The Nali tunnel, magnificent fjord views, the Kjosfossen waterfall, runs from the end of the Aurlandsfjord, a tributary of the Sognefjord, to the high mountains at Myrdal station

Cost: NOK 350 (one way), NOK 500 (round trip), Eurail pass holders get 30% discount.

4. The Cinque Terre Express, Italy



Route: Levanto to La Spezia

Highlights: Ligurian Sea, pastel villages, terraced vineyards, seafood, discovery of Cinque Terre National Park, UNESCO World Heritage Site, and the most beautiful beaches

Cost: One-way tickets cost €5 for adults. Eurail passes are accepted.

5. The Golden Pass Line, Switzerland



Route: Montreux - Interlaken - Lucerne

Highlights: Bruenig Pass, chalets decorated with flowers, the Gruben (Schoenried) area

Cost: 1st or 2nd class reservations are CHF 20 per person, Eurail passes accepted.

6. The West Highland Line, Scotland



Route: Glasgow to Fort William and on to Mallai

Highlights: A true Hogwarts Express experience for Harry Potter fans, fascinating museums, a ferry ride to an island, a mountain gondola, beautiful Highland scenery

Cost: £57 per day round trip in 2nd class or £89 in first class. There are no one-way fares.

7. The Trans-Siberian Railway in Russia



Route: Moscow - Vladivostok, Moscow - Beijing via Mongolia, Moscow - Beijing via Manchuria

Highlights: Connects Europe with China, Japan, Korea and even Vietnam and Southeast Asia, an unforgettable world-class travel experience, safe, comfortable and affordable

Cost: 300 € for a second class car, 150 € for a third class car per person. 450 € to 500 € for a second class carriage per person. (depending on the route chosen)

8. The Royal Scotsman in Scotland



Route: Tours start and end at Edinburgh Waverley station

Highlights: The lush green hills of Perthshire and the breathtaking landscapes of Aberdeenshire and Angus. Enjoy luxurious amenities - 24-hour steward service, fine dining with a full Scottish breakfast and private tours. The main route of this train is Edinburgh > Kingdom of Fife > Highlands > Boat of Garten > Aberdeenshire > Angus > Dundee > Edinburgh.

Cost: from £4,500 per person for 2 nights to over £13,000 for 7 nights.

9. The Al Andalus Express route, Spain



Route: Seville to Malaga

Highlights: Luxury train, longest journey on Spanish tracks, 7 days and 6 nights, visiting cities such as Seville, Cordoba, Cadiz, Ronda and Granada.

Cost: from 8.000 € per person

10. The Rhine Valley Railway, Germany



Route: Koblenz to Mainz

Highlights: Rhine wine - Riesling is king, but also try Mueller-Thurgau and Gewuerztraminer. Towns like Bacharach, St. Goar, Ruedesheim, Ehrenbreitstein Fortress in Koblenz, Marksburg, Stahleck, Katz and Maus castles, or Pfalz Castle on an island in the riverbed.

Cost: from \$18 (€15) per person
